GOVERNANCE

Our Joint Council (JC) meets on Thursday evening in St Luke's Parish Rooms. The role of the JC is to govern the whole benefice. The work of three previous PCC committees has been gradually merged into one body. There are many efficiencies particularly in terms of time, budgeting, purchasing and service planning from this model of governance. Some positions on the existing JC will fall vacant at the APCM and we would be very interested to hear from you if you would like to become more involved in this aspect of parish life. There are many and varied roles on offer.

The JC currently comprises Rev'd Lisa (Chair) and Rev'd Linday. Local views are represented through a Church Warden from each parish. These are Karen Franklin in Penshurst, Paul Allen in The Chidds, and Angela Ventin in Fordcombe. Working across the parishes are Matthew Stevens as Operations Manager; Bob Golds as The Buildings Rep and Karen Franklin as the Mission and Worship lead. The position of the Benefice Treasurer is currently vacant although our systems are being beautifully managed by volunteers under the expert leadership of Barry Lewis and some very natty software. Could God be calling you to be our new treasurer? Please pray about this!

LITURGY

We hope that you are enjoying the Christmas season service booklet which we will be using until Candlemas on February 2nd. Candlemas marks the turning point in the year when the Church turns from Bethlehem and the festivals of Incarnation (Christmas and Epiphany) and starts to look towards Jerusalem and the seasons of Lent and Easter. This service booklet is very similar to what you're used to, but with extra emphasis on light and the incarnation. In early February we will then share two weeks of our Ordinary time booklet.

Once Lent begins we will swap back to the liturgy written for Advent and Lent. The liturgy uses Common Worship Order Two which means that the service is structured like a traditional BCP prayer book service but uses modern language rather than that written in 1662. This liturgy is penitential in tone. We received helpful feedback on these booklets during the recent season of Advent and we will use comments from both the Advent and Lent seasons to help us devise a second draft.

FEBRUARY 14th

Unusually this year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day. This may mean that we may well be giving up chocolate while at the same time sharing it with our Valentine! – To mark this unusual clash, we are hoping to hold two services that evening, so that we're not trying to do both at once: watch this space for details.
